#### **TechnoMe Overview**

#### Each person is special!

In this course, students celebrate their own unique characteristics. They use a PowerPoint template to create an All About Me slide show. The mini biography outlines personal details, accomplishments, goals, and interests. Upon completion, students share their slide show with a friend to compare how they are similar and different. This is an excellent way to enhance self-esteem, foster relationships, and develop fundamental technology skills.



- In Session 1, students will begin creating their "All About Me" slide show. The first task is to design a title slide using a Microsoft PowerPoint template. They will enter their name in a text box and customize the font by adjusting the size, style, and color. Next, students will complete a slide template that includes descriptive sentences, providing details such as their name, age, city, and favorite activity. As an optional step, students can fill out the "Fun Facts" template, sharing additional information like their favorite subject, what annoys them, and the things they enjoy reading or watching.
- In Session 2, students complete a third slide in their All About Me slide show, which centers on a career goal. They do this by finishing the sentence, "When I grow up, I want to be a...". They insert an image representing what they aspire to be in the future. Next, they create a text box and type in the desired job title. Upon completion, students discuss their work with peers.
- In Session 3, students will create the fourth slide in their "All About Me" slide show, showcasing things they enjoy. To kick off the activity, they will take a digital photo of themselves. Using a slide template with a flower shape, each petal will be filled with a clipart representing their favorite things. In the center, students will insert a cropped version of their photo. This slide can be printed for display on a class bulletin board. For an extra fun activity, students can place their photo into a puzzle template, cut out the pieces, and reassemble the image.
- In Session 4, students create a slide about their family. They create a graph that shows the number of adults, children, and pets in their home. Using shapes, they use different images for each type of family member. An optional activity is available that has students construct their family tree using a cloud shape to add each person's name to a branch.
- In Session 5, students add transitions to the All About Me slide show. They choose their preferred transition effect and then apply it to all slides. Then, they run the slide show to practice advancing to each slide. Afterwards, they use a checklist to verify that it is ready for viewers. Optional instructions are provided on how to incorporate any slides from previous skill reviews or extension activities into the current slide show. For instance, students may wish to include their learning goal, fun facts, family tree, or puzzle if they did those additional activities.
- In Session 6, students share their All About Me slide show with an audience. Following the presentation, they participate in a discussion to explore the similarities and differences among their classmates. They identify peers who share the same age, interests, or goals. This activity underscores both the commonalities within the group and the unique qualities of everyone.

### **Technology Integration Ideas**

The TechnoMe course integrates technology into an All About Me social studies unit. The activities are an ideal way for children to develop self-awareness, accept differences in others, and build relationships. The activities are completed using a template, which supports beginners with limited keyboarding and computing skills. This course can be modified for older students by customizing the template to add additional slides using provided resources.

Benefits to incorporating an All About Me unit into curriculum:

- Build Self-Esteem: Use the All About Me activities to have students reflect upon what makes them special. By recognizing characteristics that make them unique, students develop a sense of self-worth.
- Learn about Students: Use the All About Me activities to get to know your students. Discover their strengths, goals, likes, and personal interests. This is a fun way for students to tell you about themselves. Use this information to support learning.
- Develop Friendships: Use the All About Me activities to help students recognize others in the class that have similar interests. This can become a starting point for fostering relationships amongst students.
- Build a Sense of Community: Use the All About Me activities to have students learn about one another. By sharing personal details students form a connection with one another.
- Develop Oral Communication Skills: Use the All About Me activities to have students practice public speaking and active listening.

Suggestions for sharing the TechnoMe slide shows with others:

- Determine an Audience: Prior to beginning the unit inform students who will be seeing their slide shows. Decide if students will share their presentation with the entire class or a small group of students. Consider expanding the audience to include family members. You can email a slide show to parents or print the slide show to create an All About Me booklet.
- Create a Class Album for an Open House: Build a sense of community. Combine completed slide shows into a class album using instructions in Session 6. The album can be set to play automatically in the classroom during Open House or printed and placed outside the classroom door to introduce parents to the class.
- Make a Class Bulletin Board: Personalize your classroom. Print Slide 4 in the template, which is the flower decorated with a student photo and images of things they like. Use the printouts to create a We Grow and Learn in Class X bulletin board.

Ideas for extending the activities in the TechnoMe course:

- Engage in Goal Setting: Have students set a personal or school-related goal using the template in Session 1 Skill Review. Brainstorm options for meeting the goal and then establish a plan. Monitor progress towards achieving the goal. Celebrate successful completion of the goal.
- Build a My Family Graph: Recognize similarities and differences in families. List the members in the immediate family using the template in Session 3 Skill Review. Print the slide. Assemble the printouts into a simple graph to compare the number of people in each family. Use questioning to develop mathematical reasoning. For example, How many people have four members in their family? What is the biggest family size? What is the smallest family size?

- Collaborate to Complete a Puzzle: Recognize the unique physical characteristics of others. Transform a student photo into a puzzle using the resources in Session 3 Extension Activity. Trade with a friend that has the same number of puzzle pieces. Draw attention to the fact that although the puzzle design is the same, each puzzle is unique. Mix the two puzzle pieces together for an extra challenge.
- Use a Graphic Organizer to Compare Similarities and Differences: Identify similarities and differences in others. Form a partner group. Have each person talk about themselves while the other practices actively listening. Afterwards, each person completes the Venn diagram in Session 5 Extension Activity. If working with older students, share the same diagram to have students jointly complete the organizer.



#### Open PowerPoint and the All About Me Template



#### Add Student Name to the Title Slide


> Place the cursor inside Student.

Double click to select the word.




#### Format the Font

  Pick a font from the list.






#### Format the Font Style


- ▷ Select your name.

#### Format the All About Me Title



### **Assignment 7 About Graphs**

You are going to make a graph about your family. You will show how many adults, children, and pets are in your family by using shapes. Each type of information will have its own shape, so it's easy to understand the graph.

Before you get started, learn about graphs.

#### What is a Graph?

A **graph** is a picture used to show information. A **pictograph** is a graph that uses shapes or small pictures, instead of numbers, to show how many things there are. A graph helps people understand things better.

Information in a graph is called **data**.

Data is things we can count or learn about. For example, if you count how many children are in your family, those numbers are data.

Data helps us learn things and make decisions by counting or looking at what we know.
